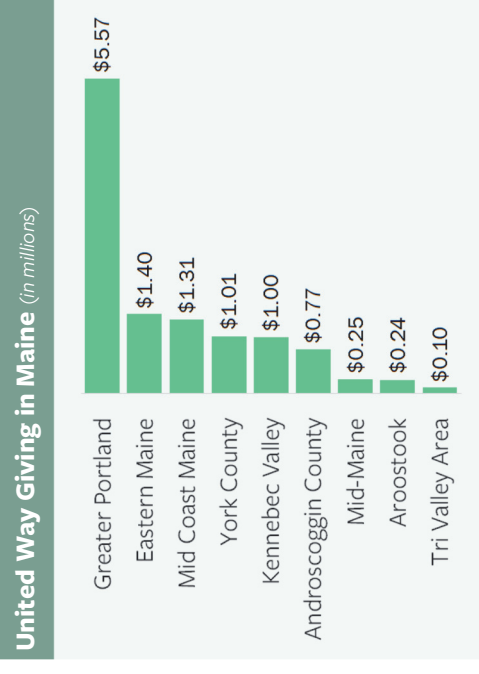
## Out-of-State Organizations

## What is a foundation?

A foundation is a non-governmental nonprofit, 501(c)3, organization that supports charitable activities. Most give grants, but private operating foundations may directly fund their own charitable activities. Private foundation assets typically come from a family, individual, or corporation. Each year, a private non-operating foundation is required to give 5% or more of its assets to charitable activities.

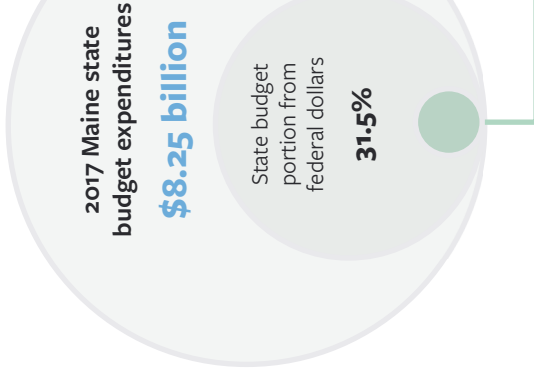
## Charitable Giving in Maine

Foundation giving represents about a **quarter of all charitable giving** in Maine.

Foundation giving represents	Total Giving By Type*
about a <b>quarter of all charitable giving</b> in Maine.	<b>Individuals</b> \$492M <b>65%</b>
By far, the <b>largest portion comes from individuals</b> across the state.	<b>Foundations</b> \$182M <b>24%</b>
Together, <b>charitable bequests</b> and an estimate of <b>corporate giving</b> total just over 10%.	<b>Bequests</b> \$47M <b>6%</b>
<b>Individual</b> giving saw the largest annual change at 6.2% <b>outpacing national growth by 1%</b> .	<b>Corporations</b> \$39M <b>5%</b>

# The Most Active Maine Funders

## A Closer Look at the Top 25 Maine Funders

A small percentage of the hundreds of Maine foundations are responsible for the majority of funding distributed throughout the state.

We compile this **list of the top 25 Maine funders, measured by annual giving to Maine**, to provide a closer look at the giving of the most active organizations in Maine's philanthropic community each year.

### Maine Funders

To be considered a *Maine Funder* for this report, an organization must be incorporated or registered with the state of Maine or be subject to the legal jurisdiction of a Maine municipality. Included are private and community foundations, as well as public charities receiving a majority of their contributions from non-government sources. Excluded are certain operating foundations and other entities whose charitable giving is exclusive to one or more supported organizations.
